**RE: Jason Whittington**

The Society did request a period of supervised access following a report from Mr. Whittington's psychiatrist Dr. Taylor which stated that Mr. Whittington is diagnosed with Mixed Personality Features; specifically Antisocial, Borderline and Narcissistic traits and that he has difficulty controlling his temper and can fly into rages. Given this information, the Society requested a period of supervised access to ensure that Mr. Whittington's mental health challenges did not have an impact on his ability to provide direct care with the children following the breakup of his marriage.

On April 28, 2015, the Society received information that despite the agreed plan that Mr. Whittington's access be supervised, he had in fact had the children for an overnight unsupervised visit the night prior. We attended the home to meet with both parents and made efforts to develop a new plan for access.

Mr. Whittington was difficult to engage and refused to develop a plan stating that he would not drive his eldest child to school because he doesn't agree with the change in schools. At the conclusion of the meeting, the workers were unable to develop a plan for access that everyone would agree to.

The Society is not currently restricting Mr. Whittington's access to the children or requiring supervision.

There continues to be concerns related to the stability of his mental health, his ability to focus on the needs of the children rather than his own needs, as well as concerns about his level of alcohol use.

The Society will require the ongoing cooperation of Mr. Whittington in order to further monitor and assess these concerns.
