

PETITION

WHEREAS the courts of Canada systematically failed Alexandra, Paige and Clayton Misener, causing them to flee Canada for their own safety;

AND WHEREAS the same courts initiated and continue to carry out malicious prosecutions causing great suffering and harm to the same family;

AND WHEREAS it is highly unlikely that the family will ever get fairness or justice in Canada or any of its proxies, including France;

AND IN CONSIDERATION of the attached letter of complaint (<http://www.runningaway.ca/docs/Letter-Judicial-Council.html>) against specifically named judges, and the judiciary in general;

WE THE UNDERSIGNED give our support to the Misener family, and the Friends of Alex and Paige in their efforts to remove judges from the Canadian courts who:

- (a) fail to respect the natural right of children to attend court and testify directly as to their experiences;
- (b) fail to protect children knowing that they will face continued sexual abuse;
- (c) fail to respect the most basic of rights of court participants - notice, disclosure, legal representation and fair participation;
- (d) accept and rely on the opinion of unqualified, non-medical workers who diagnose without license and deceitfully manipulate the courts into believing trends and fads as science;
- (e) allow secret hearings, without even giving notice to other parties, and enable lawyers to do the same without sanction;
- (f) deliberately bureaucratize the courts with administrative requirements that limit access to justice to only lawyers and people who can afford them.

WE THE UNDERSIGNED AGREE THAT:

"The law and courts in Canada play an important role in Canadian society. We prefer to live in a country that is orderly, fair and just; however, the actions of the judges in this case, and the judiciary as a whole, are intolerable. We no longer see our courts as effective, practical and reliable. They are, more and more, failing to represent the conscience of the Canadian public, especially in respect to the protection of sexually abused children. We demand change."

"The courts must be reminded that they exist for and by us, and not the other way around. Compliance with law is voluntary. There are not enough police officers in the country to maintain order if the populous decides against it. Judges have for some time used the Canadian legal system as their own little fiefdom, forgetting who they serve - paying more attention to walls of rules and forms and lawyers than the spirit of law, what

is right and what is not. In the case of Alexandra, Paige and Clayton Misener, the justice system has fallen way short of our expectations. It does not represent our views, it has lost the confidence of the people."
