EXPLOSIVE CHILD SEX ABUSE TRIAL TO COMMENCE IN DECEMBER NIAGARA REGIONAL POLICE, OPP, FACS NIAGARA ON LIST OF LITIGANTS

Several Canadian police forces, childrens aid organizations and government authorities have been implicated in an explosive and nightmarish sex abuse scandal involving two Ontario teens, according to a major civil lawsuit brought on behalf of Alexandra, Paige and Clayton Misener.

All parties have now been served and will soon have to account to the courts. The matter will be heard at the First Circuit Court at Saint Pierre on December 12, 2022.

Evidence has been presented that shows the two young girls were in an abusive and dangerous situation, begged for protection from authorities but were overlooked, neglected and then hunted down like terrorists when they took measures to protect themselves. The abuse took place at the home of their "biological mother."

Kelly Nina Campbell, their biological mother, and Jason Kenneth Whittington, Campbell's boyfriend at the time (who has a lengthy and violent criminal history, major psychological concerns and judicial orders to keep away from children) are both implicated; however, neither have been properly investigated nor charged by police. Their father, Clayton Misener, is credited with effectively rescuing them, protecting them and helping them to escape Canadian authorities intent on forcing their return.

Canadian and French authorities have significantly stepped up their attempts to silence the family through bullying and harassment, often at the hands of French military police.

They are accused of suborning torture, the torture of children and other heinous acts by way of the parties' wanton and willful abuse of power, deliberate misleading of judicial authorities, ignoring reports of sexual abuse made by children and wrongfully corroborating political interference and malicious prosecution.

The parties' deliberate actions, and failures to act where reasonably required to do so, have resulted in severe consequences for the victims, including without limitation abandonment, severe emotional distress, forced relocation, victimization, re-victimization, isolation, public demonization and vilification, and other short- and long-term consequences.

While the courts have the ultimate decision making authority in respect to the share of liability, the claim poses a serious financial risk for all involved. This case may well influence court decisions for years to come. Furthermore, the public release of documents in support of the claim, including classified diplomatic cables, will likely expose serious wrongdoing and embarrass public officials. While the exact monetary value of the claim is being kept confidential at this time, it can be reasonably expected to reach into the tens of millions.

Investigations into the role played by news media, social media, corrupt French officials and other litigants continues, to be addressed under separate cover.
